Extract from a letter dated Natchez Oct. 11th, addressed to a gentleman of this place.

“Not long after the independence of West Florida was declared, I had the honor of visiting the fort at Baton Rouge which was in possession of the Republicans; a convention was sitting and the laws that have passed, similar to those of the U. States. General Thomas, with whom I had an interview, expressed a wish, that they should become one of the U. States, and add one more Star to our flag, their flag is a Blue with white border, and a large Star in the centre; at that time there was a part of the inhabitants of the frontiers, bordering on Ponshitrone and the river Thickafa that rose in opposition to the convention — General Thomas has visited them with troops, taken their fort, and dispersed the enemy. The country is at peace and considered as a Republic.”
